



Recommended Router Configuration in Connecting to IX

#### 1. 概要

#### Recommended router configuration for connecting to an Internet Exchange

#### Abstract

An Internet Exchange (IX) is an important infrastructure for exchanging Internet traffic between network service providers. For this reason, AS operators should have a common understanding and be aware of the technical requirements of connecting to an IX.

This document aims to improve the operation and stability of an IX. It describes the recommended configuration of routers connected to an IX by an AS operator, including Peering LAN, a LAN on which many individual ASes connect to.

This document does not describe information about routing outside of connecting to an IX. For example, the contents of routing information which a network service provider advertises to their peers and the contents of traffic which is exchanged between network service providers are excluded from this document.

~ Main topics on recommended router configuration ~

- Stop sending link-local traffic
  - Vendor proprietary protocols (CDP, FDP, EDP...), IGP protocols (OSPF, IS-IS, EIGRP...), Spanning Tree BPDU, Multicast routing protocols (PIM, DVMRP...), BOOTP/DHCP, HSRP/VRRP/ESRP, IPv6 RA, LLDP...
- Stop sending ICMP redirects
  - ICMP redirect function might contaminate the routing table of routers of IX members
- Prohibit forwarding directed broadcast packets
  - Directed broadcast might facilitate smurf attack to the IX segment
- Disable proxy ARP
  - Proxy ARP might cause BGP sessions bringing down between members
- Don't advertise the prefix of IX segments
  - Advertising the prefix of IX segment might cause malicious attacks from unexpected network and traffic loss due to BGP sessions down





#### Conclusion

- Translating the BCOP document of router configuration globally helps network engineers in their work.
